
Sketchbook Assignment




Estimated time: 3-6 hours per week

Assignment: You are asked to keep a sketchbook for this class. Each student is to sketch 4 drawings per week in his/her sketchbook in addition to what ever is assigned you for that week.

- 1. Draw anything but the figure.
- 2. Draw out "whole" compositions. Not just one object floating in space.
- 3. Use black ink pen
- 4. Mask off where your composition ends with a drawn border or a taped off border
- 5. Layer your drawings. Reach for the darks one directional light source.








Composition:

It is important that the whole surface of the picture plane was utilized. Effectively creating a drawing which shows us not just an "object", but a play of negative space, shape, value, and movement.



Line:

Everyone approaches their drawings a little differently. But there are important things to look for when using line. Variation of speed, value, thickness, and layering. A good drawing may contain all of these, or a mixture of a few. The main thing to notice is if you are using line in recording "contour" or "mass". "Mass" is what I am looking for.
